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# A. GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION 2016 (GDPR)

The GDPR is a regulation that will become applicable from 25th May 2018. Its intention is to strengthen data protection for individuals across the European Union.

Compliance is essential as fines under the GDPR are up to a maximum of 20 million Euro or 4% of turnover.

The GDPR strengthens the controls that organisations (data controllers) are required to have in place over the processing of personal data, including pseudonymised data.

LMC Law has agreed to deliver a seminar for our members to provide a better understanding of GDPR and the impact it will have on General Practice.

It will cover the following areas:

- What is GDPR and what does it mean for General Practice?
- Current obligations and obligations for General Practice/patients
- Data Protection Officers: roles and responsibilities
- Data Protection Impact Assessments
- Privacy Notices
- Lawful basis for processing
- Breach and penalties

The seminar will take place on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> April (7.00pm) in Leicester – Email invitations have now been circulated to members.

#### **B. FEEDBACK ON SHARED CARE AGREEMENTS**

The LMC is seeking to improve the arrangements with Shared Care Agreements.

The issues already identified include a lack of a process for exception reporting, failure of hospital consultants to follow approved process and inadequate remuneration.

We would like to hear from colleagues on any other concerns they have about the process in regard to Shared Care Agreements, so they can form part of the negotiation process with CCGs. In particular, I am aware there is a disconnect between the monitoring required by the CCGs and the monitoring required by LMSG. Any specific examples of this would be very useful.

The LMC has sought advice from our legal representatives and BMA Law. Following the advice provided to the LMC, we are now in discussion with the Trading Standards inspector to find a favourable resolution for practices.

The LMC would advise all LMC practices to not change any scales until this matter is resolved.

# H. VACCINE ORDERING FOR THE 2018-19 INFLUENZA SEASON

LLR LMC are aware of the ongoing discussions and concerns regarding vaccine ordering the for the 2018-19 influenza season.

The LMC Buying Group has been in negotiations with suppliers on behalf of our members and <u>full</u> <u>update can be read here</u>

NHS England has released its 'definitive' guidance for GP practices about which flu vaccines to use for the 2018-19 season.

NHS England is now advising all practices to use the adjuvanted trivalent vaccine (Fluad - Seqirus) for all patients over 65 and a quadrivalent vaccine for any 'at risk' groups including pregnant women aged 18-65 years.

This decision has been based on clinical evidence from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) and cost effectiveness studies by Public Health England.

Suppliers of the adjuvanted trivalent and quadrivalent vaccines have given NHS England assurances that they will be able to cope with the increased demand for their vaccines.

Additional funding has been found to cover the additional costs of using the adjuvanted trivalent and quadrivalent vaccines, so practices do not need to worry about not being reimbursed.

Please note that practices will still need to order trivalent vaccines for any at risk patients age six months to two years as Fluenz, Fluad and quadrivalent vaccines aren't licensed for this age group. MASTA, Mylan and Seqirus can provide vaccines suitable for children age six months and above. For more information on these discounts, please visit our website.

As this definitive guidance was released after most practices would have placed their vaccine order with their preferred supplier, we have spoken with the four companies we negotiated discounts with for the 2018-19 season to compile advice for those practices that now need to cancel or amend their original vaccine orders (see next pages).

A further update as Seqirus has extended its 'early bird' pricing until 29 March.

### I. SUMMARISING PATIENTS RECORDS



The LMC has recently been asked whether the summarising of patient's records is a contractual requirement. Although this is no longer an indicator within QOF, accurately summarised notes still remain an important part within general practice.

......In some areas of the country, where all practices are using the same software system, GP2GP appears to work beautifully, as intended – meaning the summariser has little work to do for some newly registering patients. However, for the majority of us, as patients transfer from a practice using one software system to another using a different software system, the summariser must still check the paper records for accuracy.

Despite the carrot of QOF points not being there anymore for summarising, accurately summarised notes are vital in today's NHS where the clinicians simply don't know their patients as well as in the old family doctor days and time pressures on GPs and Practice Nurses mean that an accurate history on the screen is imperative for care, diagnosis, treatment and referral. With a reported 98% of practices now being able to add additional information to the Summary Care Record, an accurate medical summary is even more important.
